THERE ARE few things that God outright commands us to do; baptism is one of them!

Jesus said,

16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. *Mark 16:16*

The Apostle Peter said,

38 Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

Acts 2:38

In other words, “baptism,” is said in the same breath as, “repent.” The two are intended by God to be engaged in together; they are inseparable.


